Learning about Forests (LEAF) encourages students to reconnect with their environment through the medium of trees, instilling in them a sense of ownership of their environment which will allow them to become advocates for the protection of their nature for the benefit of their own selves, their communities and the future generations.

The LEAF programme is implemented in 27 countries worldwide and involves over 10,000 schools and 760,000 students. Over half a million trees are planted through the programme during each academic year.
